What You Need To Know

Veterinary assistants have a broad range of responsibilities and will typically divide their time between assisting the receptionists, helping doctors with physical examinations, dispensing medications, and helping veterinary technicians position patients for and process radiographs, prepare patients for surgery, provide nursing and comfort care, and perform treatments or basic laboratory diagnostic tests.

On the job, you will:

- Build positive, professional relationships with clients and staff members.
- Pursue significant on-the-job training

What Do You Need To Succeed In This Role?

Requirements

- Must be at least 18 years of age
- Know the range of services the practice provides and the species it treats.
- Be reasonably familiar with breeds and coat colors.
- · Accurately estimate weights of patients.
- · Give directions to the practice.
- Follow OSHA standards. Be able to find Safety Data Sheets quickly.
- Know and use standard medical and business abbreviations.
- Use proper medical terminology when speaking and writing.
- Understand the life cycle and pathology of common parasites (intestinal parasites, heartworms, fleas, ticks), and know the names of most common preventatives, recommended treatments, and diagnostics.
- Be familiar with zoonotic (contagious) diseases, including their prevention and steps to reduce or eliminate transmission.
- Know the policies regarding provision of veterinary care, treatment of stray animals, deposits for hospitalized patients, payments, credit, pet health insurance, and finance fees.
- · Competently speak and write the English language.
